<u>Home Learning Expectations</u>

This year, each teacher in the Kotahitanga whānau will set their own home learning expectations based on the identified needs of their learners.

All Year 5-8 learners are encouraged to use their time at home to talk with you about what they are learning in class, spend time playing outside or on a screen-free hobby, and to read for enjoyment for at least 20 minutes a day. It is widely accepted that these three behaviours are associated with improved academic achievement.

Some learners may also be expected to use their own time to complete classwork if they have been given adequate time in class and it is not up to their expected effort.

School Uniform

Now that we are back into a new school term we expect that all children will be in the correct school uniform. <u>Girls may wear black tights if they are cold and boys are to wear long black socks.</u> (no leggings for boys). This includes our PE/Sports uniform – no other options apart from the correct uniform please. If your child is not able to wear the correct uniform, they will need to bring in a note to give to the office to receive a uniform pass.

During the winter term, we sell Alfriston School Beanies from the office. If you would like to purchase one, you can do so through our Alfriston School website. We have an Alfriston School jacket, which can be purchased as an additional layer for learners outside of the classroom.

Uniform requirements

- Fully black leather shoes (winter/summer)
- Black socks (long or short)
- Hair must be tied up if below the collar using black, brown, white or navy hair ties.
- Nail polish is not permissible
- Earrings must be small gold or silver studs only
- Students wearing vests/singlets/thermals must ensure that they are not visible
