# **Class News**

# <u>Room 1</u>

Room 1 finished off the last term creating some amazing artworks. They were busy working on their art skills by using different materials and techniques. Learners created landscapes with watercolour paints. They had to be very patient creating these artworks and talked about mixing, brushstrokes, value of the paint colours, foregrounds and backgrounds. You can see these artworks on display in Room 1.



Room 1 also spent a week learning all about Matariki. The students learnt about the stars that make up the Matariki cluster and some of the different myths and legends about Matariki. Room 1 also enjoyed learning about the Northern Lights. They ended the week by creating some artworks of the Matiriki cluster and the Northern Lights. Here are some of the artworks.

#### Gymnastics

This week we had our very first session of gymnastics. We teamed up with Room 2 and traveled by bus to Bruce Pullman. We began with a warm-up learning the tuck sit, L-shape and straddle. Then, we had a go using these skills on the equipment in groups and rotated around the stations. We learnt that good gymnasts are quiet, meaning that we need to make sure our movements are slow and careful.



#### PE rotations

The Year 3/4 classes have begun PE rotations. Each teacher is teaching a different sport. These include basketball, netball, touch rugby and soccer. For the rotations, the classes rotate around and do two sessions per week. We had so much fun! We made sure we participated, played fairly and showed good sportsmanship.



#### Writing

In Writing, we are building up to writing our own fantasy narratives. We have been focusing on designing and describing characters for our fantasy stories. We created magical characters and used adjectives to describe their inside and outside features. Then, we wrote our descriptions in order to paint a picture in the reader's mind of what the character looks like, feels like and acts like. We created characters such as fairies, angels, three-headed snakes, snowmen, talking cats and dragons.



#### Topic

For Topic we have been learning about the 2022 Commonwealth games held in Birmingham this year. We learned about the history of it, what happens at the Commonwealth games and what sports are played. Then, we selected different countries in the Commonwealth and worked in groups to research them. Next, we created posters to show this information. Our research into the countries involved finding what currency is used in the country, the climate, traditional vocabulary, and more. They look incredible displayed in our classroom!
