BOARD ELECTION YEAR

2025 is a Board Election year! In Mid July we will be calling for nominations and in September you will have the opportunity to vote for 5 parent representatives. Now is the time to find out about becoming a School Board Member, I will share snippets of information in the next few newsletters.

You can also chat to myself (Mrs Cook), Mrs Galvin or our Presiding Member Paul Firth to find out what's involved.

What is a School Board?

Every state and state-integrated school/kura in New Zealand is governed by a school board (formerly known as a board of trustees). The school board is a crown entity – that is, an organisation that is part of the New Zealand public sector.

What do boards do? The board has overall responsibility and accountability for the school/kura. School board's legal responsibilities are determined by the Education and Training Act 2020. The Act sets out boards' four primary objectives.

These are ensuring student achievement for all of its students, including for those of differing needs, making sure the school is a safe place for all, and giving effect to the Treaty of Waitangi. As part of its focus on these four objectives, boards' responsibilities include:

- Setting the strategic direction for the school
- Protecting the school's values
- Monitoring and evaluating student learning outcomes
- Approving policies
- Financial stewardship
- Building community engagement and support

It's important to note that the board does NOT get involved in the day-to-day running of the school
