The Parent Portal, a new webspace for parents and whānau, is now available on education.govt.nz.

It houses practical videos, activities, and resources to support learning that are easy to understand – empowering whānau to take a more active role in their child's education.

This includes 'parent-friendly' versions of both The New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga o Aotearoa, so they'll know exactly what their child is learning, why it's important, and when they'll be learning it.

We have also developed engaging videos that provide parents, carers and whānau with guidance on topics such as preparing for the first day of school or kura, understanding the first six months of learning, and resources and activities for supporting learning at home.

As the national curriculum continues to be refreshed over the next few years, we'll keep adding a wide range of activities designed to cater to different year levels and learning needs. Our goal is that this section of the education website becomes a tool for every family, regardless of their child's learning journey or language needs.

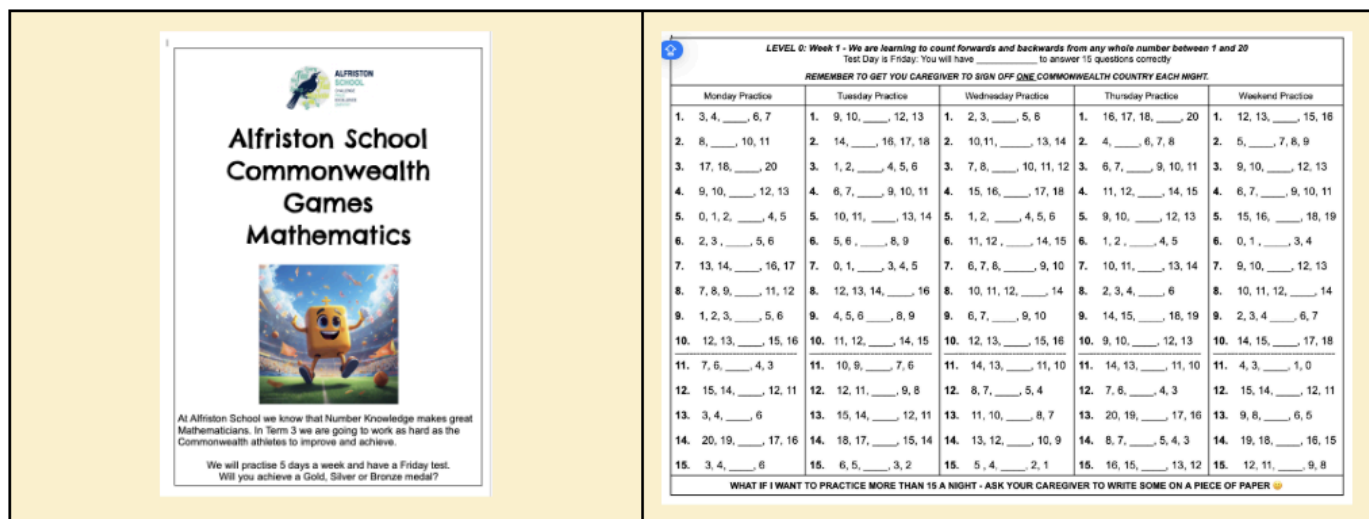
Term 3 – Commonwealth Games Mathematics

Next term we are going to be using the Commonwealth Games Event to focus on many areas of the NZ curriculum and will use this theme to encourage ALL learners to further develop their Number Knowledge.

We know that Number Knowledge is the foundation for all Maths learning therefore we are going to have a really big push in this area during Term 3. This will involve parent support at home to make this a success and help to accelerate your child's progress and achievement.

READ ON TO BECOME FAMILIAR WITH OUR TERM 3 NUMBER KNOWLEDGE FOCUS.....

1) On the first day of Term 3 your child will bring home a 'Tracking Booklet' along with their first week's learning sheet.



2) We ask that you encourage your child to complete one strip per night (Monday – Thursday and another on any day from Friday – Sunday). Once your child has completed the practise strip for that day we ask that you sign off one of the country flags in their booklet – only one per day please 😊

3) Learners keep the booklet and Weekly Practice Sheet at home for every day EXCEPT MONDAY.

On Monday we need the booklet and completed Practice Sheet returned to school. Monday is the weekly test day (see point 5). On Monday afternoon your child will bring home their next week's learning sheet.

4) Every Monday your child will get a strip of math questions as a test, this will be very similar to the questions that they have been practising over

the week. If your child scores 100% in the allocated time (*time limit will be clearly stated at the top of the weekly sheet*), they will earn the sport code for that week and have it signed off in their booklet 😊 The idea is to get all 10 sports signed off by the end of the term.

ACHIEVEMENT

Can you earn the 10 Sports Badges in a Term?

Each day you will be able to practice your weekly test and on Friday if you score 100% you get the sports badge.



If you missed a badge keep practising that week's tests and you can try one more time ...in Week 10.

Will you earn a GOLD, SILVER or BRONZE?? Gold earns one learner certificate and one values certificate – Go for it!!
